Reasoning and Problem Solving

- Notice any underlying problems that a student might be facing.
- Analyze ideas and use logic to determine the student's strengths and weaknesses.
- Use reasoning to discover answers to problems.
- Combine several pieces of information and draw conclusions.
- Recognize the nature of a problem.
- Think of new ideas about a topic.
- Recognize when important changes happen or are likely to happen in a system.
- Think of original, unusual, or creative ways to solve problems.
- Identify what must be changed to reach goals.
