Baseband transmission

- The transmission data is bi-directional.
- A short distance signal travelling.
- Frequency division multiplexing is not possible.
- It works well with bus topology.
- It is best for wired networks.
- Example: Ethernet is using baseband for LAN.

Broadband transmission

- The transmission data is unidirectional.
- Signal travelling distance is long.
- Frequency division multiplexing is possible.
- It is used with a bus as well as tree topology.
- It is best for non-wired networks.
- Example: used to transmit cable TV to premises.

what is the difference between a hub, modem, router and a switch?

Ans.

Hub - • Hub is a physical layer devices that falls under layer 1 of the OSI model.

• A hub operates using broadcasting.

Modem - • A modem is a networking device that converts digital signals into analog signals for transmission over phone line or other types of communication channels.

• Modems are typically used to connect devices to the internet or other wide-area networks.

Switch - • Switch is a data connection layer device since it is a member of layer 2 of the OSI model.

- Switches operate based on MAC addresses.

Router - • A router is a network layer device which because it's a member of layer 3 of the OSI model.

- Routers operate based on IP addresses.

Ans. Yes, that's because MAC addresses are hard-wired into the NIC circuitry, not the PC. This also means that a PC can have a

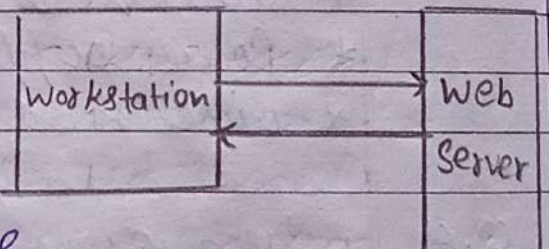
different MAC address when the NIC card was replaced by another one.

Q.8 Define Static IP and Dynamic IP? Discuss the difference between IPV4 and IPV6.

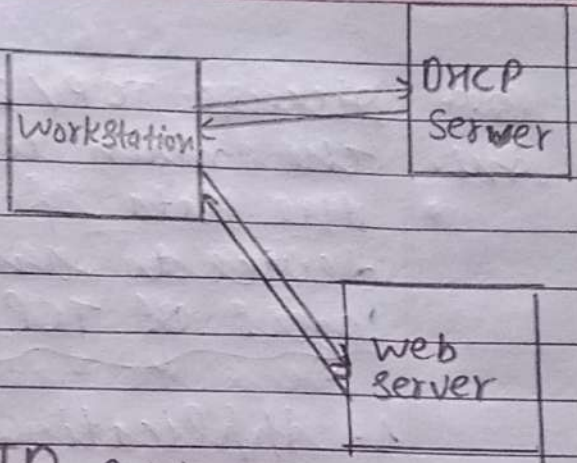
