Twitter, [b][13] is an online <u>social media</u> and <u>social networking service</u> operated by the American company <u>X Corp.</u>, the successor of <u>Twitter, Inc.</u> On Twitter, <u>registered users</u> can post texts, images and videos. [14] Users can post (tweet), <u>like, repost</u> (or retweet), comment and quote posts, and <u>direct message</u> other registered users. Users interact with Twitter through browser or mobile <u>frontend</u> software, or programmatically via its application programming interfaces (APIs).

Twitter was created in March 2006 by <u>Jack Dorsey</u>, <u>Noah Glass</u>, <u>Biz Stone</u>, and <u>Evan Williams</u>. It was launched in July of that year. Its former parent company, Twitter, Inc., was based in <u>San Francisco</u>, <u>California</u> and had more than 25 offices around the world. [15] By 2012, more than 100 million users produced 340 million tweets a day, [16] and the service handled an average of 1.6 billion <u>search queries</u> per day. [17][18][16] In 2013, it was one of the ten <u>most-visited websites</u> and has been described as "the <u>SMS</u> of the Internet". [19] By the start of 2019, Twitter had more than 330 million monthly active users. [20] In practice, the vast majority of tweets are produced <u>by a minority</u> of users. [21][22] In 2020, it was estimated that approximately 48 million accounts (15% of all accounts) were not genuine people. [23]

In October 2022, billionaire <u>Elon Musk acquired</u> Twitter for US\$44 billion, gaining control of the platform and becoming CEO.[24][25][26][27] Since the acquisition, the platform has been criticized for facilitating an increase in content containing <u>hate speech</u>.[28][29][30] <u>Linda Yaccarino</u> succeeded Musk as CEO on June 5, 2023, with Musk remaining as Chairman and CTO.[10][31][32] In July 2023, Musk announced that Twitter will be rebranded to X and that the bird logo will be phased out.
