Google Gmail

- 1. Go to the Gmail website.
- 2. At the bottom of the sign in screen, click the create account link.
- 3. On the account creation screen, fill out all the fields (A) and then click Next (B).z

- 7. Choose a country code, type in a phone number, and then click

the Next button.

9. Navigate through the rest of the prompts and your account is opened.

- 2. Fill out the required fields (A) and then click the **Continue** (B) button.

Note

These instructions only work with Outlook 2007, 2010, and 2013.

- 1. Open Outlook.
- 2. In the *Add Account Setup* window, make sure the circle next to **E-mail Account** is selected.
- 3. Fill out the form, and then click the Next > button.
- 4. Once the setup process is done, check the box next to Change account settings, and then click the Next > button.
- 5. Click More settings.
- 6. Click the Advanced tab.
- 7. Next to Root folder path: type Inbox.
- 8. Click **OK**, and then **Finish**.



Mozilla Thunderbird

1. Open <u>Thunderbird</u>.

- 2. Click **Tools**, and then select **Account settings** from the <u>drop-down menu</u> that appears.
- 3. Click the circle next to **Email account** and then click **Next**.
- 4. Enter your name and an e-mail address that you want to use.
- 5. Select <u>POP</u> or <u>IMAP</u> for your server.
- 6. Enter your **e-mail address** for the incoming and outgoing user names, and then click **Next**.
- 7. Choose an Account Name.
- 8. Verify your account information and then click **Finish**.
- 9. Choose an Outgoing server.
